







What does our day look like?

The children also have access to a variety of Continuous Provision including Creative Areas, Role Plays and Investigation Areas, alongside the Reception Garden.

Home Reading

"Reading is a journey, not a race"

Initially children will choose a bedtime book to share with an adult over the weekend. This is an opportunity to discuss the story, pictures and language and to talk about what they enjoyed. There is no expectation that your child read this book independently.

As you child is introduced to more sounds, blending books and phonetically decodable books will be sent home. They will change their books once a week. Your child will bring home 2 books that are matched to their phonics groups.

At our school, our priority is that all children leave as confident and competent readers, but to do this, we need parental engagement and support.

Your child's reading record is to log any reading done <u>at home</u> and it will be checked regularly by your class teacher.

It is important that your child reads as often as they can at home and our expectation is that they **read 5 times a week** (even one page will make a big difference).




Phonics

- ▶ We teach Phonics through the Ruth Miskin Approach.
- ▶ In Reception, children are introduced to this scheme and we begin by teaching one sound a day.
- Over the Autumn Term, Phonic sessions gradually lengthen to around 30 minutes which include reading and writing speech sounds.
- ▶ On a Fridays, we will date your child's Phonics Homework Book, so you know what sounds to work on throughout the week.

Please support your child to recognise and write these sounds. This work is to be kept in their bookbag and will be checked regularly.





Maths

In Reception we teach maths using The Mastering Number Programme. This will help your child to develop good number sense.


Some of the things they are learning include:



Counting




Recognising small numbers of objects and making their own collections

We also use our helpful Numberblocks alongside our numicon to further help us in maths.

In your pack you will have a set of number cards and QR code links to the Numberblock videos to help your support your child at home with their learning.

SEND at Tudor Grange Perdiswell

- SENDCo Mrs Lucy Brooks. Working days Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday.
- The first line of support for all children with SEND is Quality First Teaching in the whole class. Lesson content is scaffolded to ensure all children have the support in place to be able to make progress. A range of resources are made available to ensure all children have strategies they can use to support their learning.
- If children need additional support in lessons, this will be allocated and delivered by a support assistant.
- At times, children may be identified for intervention to help them close gaps in their learning or support a speech and language or social and emotional need. Interventions are usually delivered in the afternoon by a support assistant. This year, children will attend interventions for a 6 week period, with approximately 2 sessions per week. This ensures interventions do not continue for long periods of time, reducing the amount of time they are with their peers in class. You will always be notified if your child has been highlighted for interventions.

- If your child is on the register for SEND, they will have a Pupil Passport. This document is written by class teachers and parents. It is reviewed termly and new targets included if previous targets have been achieved. You will be invited to a termly meeting with your child's class teacher to discuss their passport and you will have a copy to keep at home.
