
Reading Records

At our school, our priority is that all children leave as confident and competent readers, but to do this, we need parental engagement and support.

Your child's reading record is to log any reading done <u>at</u> <u>home</u> and it will be checked regularly by your class teacher.

It is important that your child reads as often as they can at home and our expectation is that they read 5 times a week (even one page will make a big difference).

Children from Year 2 onwards will be encouraged to take ownership of their reading diaries. This means when an adult cannot log their reading, they can write it in themselves to show their teacher that they have read.



Book/Poetry talks


This year, each year group from Year 1 onwards, will be asked to complete a book talk or poetry talk as part of their homework.

A book talk is a review of a book your child has read and enjoyed.


A poetry talk is where children get to share a poem they have found and related to. They may even create actions and perform the poem.

Book talks were trialled last year in Year 1 and 4 and proved to be very successful.

Book talks are a great way to promote and recommend reading to one another, as well as developing speaking and listening skills.







E-Safety

- SENDCo Mrs Lucy Brooks. Working days Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday.
- The first line of support for all children with SEND is Quality First Teaching in the whole class. Lesson content is scaffolded to ensure all children have the support in place to be able to make progress. A range of resources are made available to ensure all children have strategies they can use to support their learning.
- If children need additional support in lessons, this will be allocated and delivered by a support assistant.
- At times, children may be identified for intervention to help them close gaps in their learning or support a speech and language or social and emotional need. Interventions are usually delivered in the afternoon by a support assistant. This year, children will attend interventions for a 6 week period, with approximately 2 sessions per week. This ensures interventions do not continue for long periods of time, reducing the amount of time they are with their peers in class. You will always be notified if your child has been highlighted for interventions.

- Pupil Passport. This document is written by class teachers and parents. It is reviewed termly and new targets included if previous targets have been achieved. You will be invited to a termly meeting with your child's class teacher to discuss their passport and you will have a copy to keep at home.
- Please see the school website for our school SEND information report for more details around our Graduated Response to SEND.
