What age group would you recommend this for?

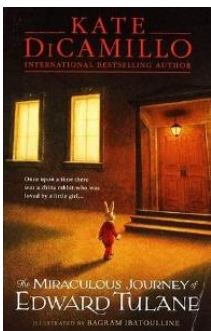
“Year 4 and above.”

What age group would you recommend this for?

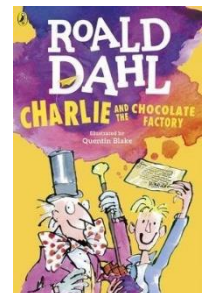
“Age 8 and above.”

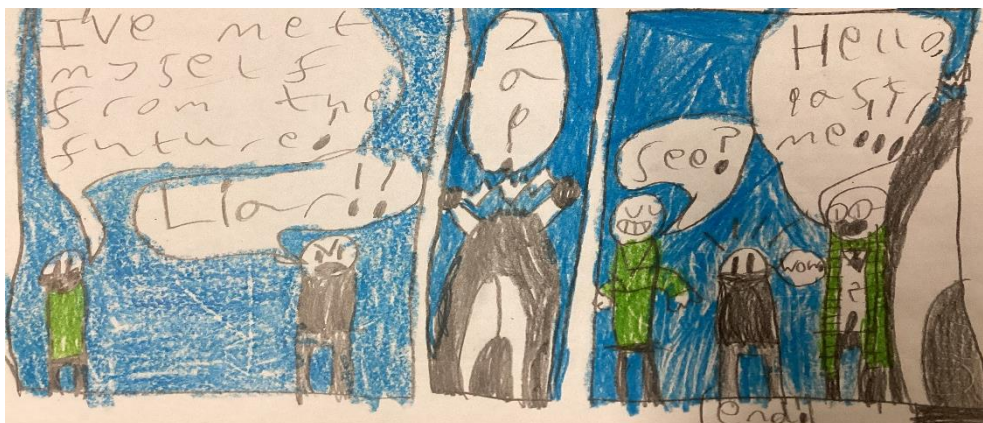

Eton Mess Recipe

- 8 small meringue cases
 - 500ml double cream
 - 1 punnet of strawberries
 - 1 tablespoon of icing sugar
 - A few drops of vanilla extract
 - Sprig of mint to serve.
1. Smash meringue cases into a bowl.
 2. Chop up strawberries.
 3. Whip cream until soft peaks.
 4. Mix it all together.
 5. Add 2-3 drops of vanilla extract.
 6. Add one tablespoon of icing sugar.
 7. Serve in a bowl with a sprig of mint.
